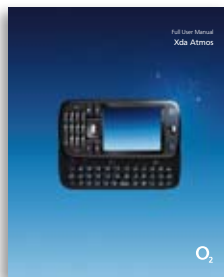

The images here are purely to illustrate what's in the box – the actual contents may look slightly different.

### Install the SIM Card

Ensure that the device is turned off and slide the battery cover off.

Press the battery cover downward to slide it open. Insert the SIM card into the slot with its metal contacts facing down. Push the SIM card all the way in until the card locks into place. Replace the battery and the battery cover.

To take the SIM card out, press and hold the slot latch then push the SIM card out from the bottom of the card.

### To install the Micro SD card (not included in the box)

Open the rubber cover of the MicroSD card slot. You'll find this on the right side of your Xda Atmos.

Simply insert the MicroSD card into the slot with the metal contacts facing down and then close the cover. If you need to remove the MicroSD card, press it to pop it out of the slot.



### Installing and charging the battery

The Xda Atmos comes with the new battery partially charged. So before you start using your Xda Atmos you first need to fully charge the battery. It's easy. Just press the battery cover downward to slide it open.

When you install the battery, make sure its exposed metal contacts are aligned with the connectors inside the battery compartment. Insert the contact's side of the battery first, gently push the battery into place and then replace the cover.

Charge the battery by plugging the AC adapter in to an electrical outlet, or plug the USB end to the sync connector port at the bottom of the device. The battery will be fully charged after about three hours.

To turn your Xda Atmos on or off, press and hold the **Power** button for about three seconds.



### Synchronise your Xda Atmos and computer

It's easy to synchronise your computer with your device. This enables you to keep information like contacts, emails, tasks, and appointments up-to-date on your Xda Atmos.

### To set up synchronisation software on your PC

The synchronisation software you need will depend on your computer's Operating System (OS). Either use Microsoft ActiveSync® 4.5 (or later) or Windows Mobile® Device Center to synchronise your device with your computer.

### To set up ActiveSync on Windows XP

1. Install ActiveSync 4.5 on your PC from the Getting Started section of your In-box CD.
2. Connect your Xda Atmos to your computer with the USB connection cable provided.

You'll see that the Synchronisation Setup Wizard automatically starts and will guide you to create a synchronisation partnership. Click **Next** to proceed.

3. To synchronise your Xda Atmos with your computer, clear the 'Synchronise directly with a server running Microsoft Exchange' check box and then click **Next**.
4. Select the information types that you want to synchronise, then click **Next**.

### To set up Windows Mobile™ Device Center on Windows Vista®

1. Connect your Xda Atmos to your computer. Your Windows Mobile Device Center will open.  
On the screen, click **Set up your device**.
2. Select the information you want to synchronise and click **Next**.
3. Type in a name for your phone and click **Set Up**.



### To enter information


The Xda Atmos comes with a keypad and a slide-out QWERTY keyboard.

When using the keypad, press the \* key to change the input method, or press and hold the \* key to open a menu where you can select the input method to use.

To enter numbers or symbols (these are labelled at the upper left of each key), press the **Fn** key and then press the corresponding key. Press **Fn** twice to enter all numbers or symbols.

### To make a call

Do one of the following:

1. Enter the phone number by pressing keys on the keypad, then press **Talk** .
2. Press the contact's name or number and the matching contacts will appear on the phone screen. Use the **Navigation Control** to select the contact and press **Talk** (phone icon).
3. To make a video call, enter the phone number, and then click **Menu > Video Call**.

To have a hands-free phone conversation, simply connect the USB stereo headset or a Bluetooth® headset (not included) to your device. To learn how to connect a Bluetooth headset, please refer to the Full User Manual.

### To send a text message

You can send short text messages (SMS) or a picture message to other mobile phones:

1. Press **Start > Messaging > SMS / MMS**.
2. Press **Menu > New > SMS** to create a text message or MMS to create a picture message.
3. Enter the mobile phone number (for picture messages, you can also enter an e-mail address) in **To** and then write or create your message. Press **Send**.


Note: You will need a data connection to send and receive picture messages.


### To take a picture

Use your Xda Atmos to capture those precious moments.

1. Press the **Camera** button.
2. Press **Centre OK** to take the shot.

### Send an MMS

The photos you take will be automatically saved to the My Pictures folder. You can send photos by MMS by selecting .

Or you can choose to delete by tapping  after taking the photo. The Full User Manual which comes with your Xda Atmos offers a more complete guide.

### Go online and surf the web

If you want to get online, you have a choice of different types of network depending on where you are. The Xda Atmos supports 3G, HSDPA, GPRS and Wi-Fi (also known as wireless LAN or WLAN).

### Using Wi-Fi

You will need to switch on the Wi-Fi function on the Xda Atmos. To do this please refer to the Full User Manual. O<sub>2</sub> has its own Wi-Fi service, to find out more go to [www.o2.co.uk/wlan](http://www.o2.co.uk/wlan) or contact us.

### 3G/HSDPA/GPRS

You can also connect to the internet using O<sub>2</sub>'s GPRS and 3G networks (and HSDPA where available). Please refer to the Full User Manual to learn how to connect using this method.

To use Internet Explorer® Mobile (press **Start > Internet Explorer**) to surf the web.

If you are using Wi-Fi:

1. Select the **Comm Manager** button.
2. Select the Wi-Fi button.
3. Press the centre button of the navigation key to switch on.
4. Choose the network you want to use and click **Connect**.

### Send and receive email

You can set up your Xda Atmos to send and receive emails using your preferred email service.

1. Press **Start > Messaging > New Email Account**.
2. Type in your email address and tap **Next**.
3. Click **Next**. If Auto Setup is unsuccessful, you need to manually enter the settings in the succeeding screens.
4. Type in **Your Name** and **Account Display Name**. Click **Next**.
5. Type in the **User name** and **Password** for the email account. Click **Next**.
6. Select the frequency to send and receive email. Click **Finish**.

### Microsoft Direct Push Email

Xda Atmos is powered by Windows Mobile, a pocket sized version of Microsoft Windows. It has all the features of a top of the range mobile phone and also gives you real time access to your Inbox, Calendar and Contacts which can be synchronised with your email account over the air.

To receive real-time access to your Outlook files, your company needs to be running Microsoft Exchange Server 2003 SP2 with your Xda Atmos, which has the latest Windows Mobile 6.0 software. Your IT department will need to enable wireless services on the Exchange server and also set up relevant IT security policies and permissions such as password requirements.

### Secure your Xda Atmos

You can protect your device from unauthorised access by using the SIM PIN or the device lock.

#### 1. To enable SIM PIN

You will need to enter a password to enable the SIM PIN before you can use the phone features of your Xda.

To use the SIM PIN, press **Start > Settings > Security > Enable SIM PIN**.

#### 2. To enable the device lock

The device lock needs a password to unlock the device after it has been left idle for a set period of time.

To enable this

1. Press **Start > Settings > Security > Device Lock**
2. Select the **'Prompt if device unused for'** check box and enter the time you want
3. Select the Password type
4. Enter and confirm the password, then press **Done**.



# A tour of your Xda Atmos



1. Earpiece

2. Second camera

3. QWERTY keyboard

4. Soft keys

5. Home

6. Talk

Press to answer an incoming call or dial a number.

7. Keypad

8. Navigation Control/  
Center OK

Press up, down, left and right, to move through menus and programme instructions. Press the centre of the navigation button to carry out the selection.

9. Back

10. End

Press to end a call or return to the Today screen.

### 1. Volume slider

Slide it up or down to adjust the speaker volume.

Slide it up or down to adjust the earpiece volume during a call.

### 2. Voice Command

Press to start Voice Speed Dial; press and hold to record a voice note.



### 3. Camera button

Press to launch the camera and press again to take a photo or video clip, depending on the specified capture mode.





#### 4. Power button

Press Power to turn off the display temporarily. This will switch it to Sleep mode. You can still receive calls when your Xda Atmos is in Sleep mode. Press and hold for about five seconds to turn off the power completely. This makes all the functions, including the phone, unavailable.

#### 5. Mirror (silver button)

#### 7. Speaker hole



#### 8. Sync connector/ earphone jack

Use this connector to synchronise data by connecting the provided USB Sync cable or to recharge the battery via the provided AC charger. You can also use the USB stereo headset for hands-free conversation or to listen to audio media.

#### 9. MicroSD card slot

Let's you insert a storage card (MicroSD format) for storing data.
