## Getting started

### 1. Open the rear cover

Remove the rear cover by placing the phone in one hand with the keypad facing down in the palm of your hand. Press down on the back cover with your other hand and slide it open in the direction of the arrow.



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### 2. Insert your SIM card

Open the SIM card door on the lower right. Insert the SIM card into the door with its gold-plated contacts facing down. Close the door and press down to lock it.

Please be careful not to force any of the SIM reader components, as this may cause damage. It doesn't take much pressure to insert the SIM correctly.

### 3. Insert the battery and replace the cover

Carefully connect the battery so the gold contacts connect with the row of connectors on the top left hand side of the Xda IQ (just below the camera lens). You can only fit the battery one way and you shouldn't need to use force. Gently press the battery down to secure it (there'll be a small click as it's locked into place).

Slide the battery cover towards the camera lens then lightly snap into place.



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**Smart IQ: it's a good idea to charge the battery for at least eight hours before you use your Xda IQ for the first time.**

#### **4. Charge the battery**

You need to charge the battery fully before using your Xda IQ for the first time.

Connect the AC charger to your Xda IQ and plug it into the wall. We recommend you use the AC adaptor the first time you charge your Xda IQ, and not the PC synchronisation cable.

A solid **amber** light shows your Xda IQ is being charged. This light will turn **green** when the battery is fully charged.

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#### **5. Turn on and set up for the first time**

Turn on your Xda IQ by pressing the power button on the top left-hand edge.

Your Xda IQ will start to set itself up and add settings supplied by O<sub>2</sub>.



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**Smart IQ:** you'll block your SIM card if you enter the wrong PIN three times. This means you won't be able to make or receive any calls, texts or picture messages. Don't worry – you can easily sort this out by contacting your service provider. They'll unblock it for you right away.

#### 6. Enter your PIN

When your Xda IQ restarts, it may ask you to enter the PIN for your SIM. (All new connections to O<sub>2</sub> have a PIN on their SIM.)

Tap in your PIN and select **Enter**.

If you're an O2 Ireland customer, please enter the PUK code supplied with your SIM or call Customer Service on 1909.

#### 7. Synchronise with your PC

Because your Xda IQ is designed to complement your PC as a smartphone, you can work with the same information in both places. You can synchronise your Xda IQ with Microsoft® Outlook® on your PC. This will let you keep a copy of your address book, appointments and emails on both your Xda IQ and computer. Whenever you add appointments or write emails on your phone, you can copy them across to your PC each time you connect. This way, you'll always have a back up copy of your information.

To synchronise your Xda IQ with your Windows PC, you need to install Microsoft ActiveSync® 4.1. (You'll find ActiveSync on the Getting Started CD in your Xda IQ box, along with a copy of Microsoft Outlook 2002 and a single PC licence.)

After you've installed ActiveSync, connect the USB cable to your PC and Xda IQ, then follow the on-screen instructions to get synchronised.

## Using it

### Work more conveniently

The Xda IQ is one of the most powerful connected handhelds available. It gives you more control over the way you work – and where you work. It keeps you in touch wherever you go. You can access contact information, browse the web, send emails, track appointments and much more.

### Mobile phone

Make and receive calls to keep in contact. Get in touch with the office, or send text messages.

### Internet and messaging

Use Outlook Mobile to send and receive emails with attachments, keep track of meetings and events, and keep in sync with Outlook on your PC. Compose and send picture messages or text your contacts for a speedy response.

Internet Explorer Mobile gives you fast connection to the Internet. Do your banking, check your market prices or catch up with the day's news.

### Video and pictures

Take detailed pictures or shoot video with sound. The Xda IQ has a high-resolution camera and a clear high-quality colour screen.

### A world of connections

With onboard support for GPRS and Wireless LAN, you have several ways of connecting to the Internet at a range of speeds. Just choose what suits you and your location. Bluetooth means you're wire free and can use your Xda IQ with car kits and headsets.

### Set up an email account and regularly check for new email

Your Xda IQ can be set up to retrieve emails.

1. On the home screen press **Start** and **Messages** then select **Outlook Email**.
2. Click **Menu > Options > New Account**.
3. In **Your Name** option, enter your name; under **Email Address**, enter the email address of your account. Under **Automatic setup**, leave a tick in the box.\* Click **Next**.

\*(If you are trying to integrate a non Internet Service Provider (ISP) account, such as your work email account, you may need to speak to your IT contact for the required settings and input these manually. Leave a tick out of this box.)

4. **Auto Setup**: wait till the settings have been obtained and the box states **Finished**. Click **Next**.
5. **Password**: enter your account password, input a tick in the **Save Password** option if required, click **Next**.
6. Click **Next**.
7. Click **Next**.

8. Under **Download the following messages**, confirm the time period of mails to be downloaded and part of the email to be downloaded (such as entire message). Click **Next**.

9. In the box below **Connect automatically and check for messages**, you can set the delay before your email is checked (such as every 15/30/60 mins). Click **Next** then **Finish**.

**Your email account is now setup.**

## A tour of your Xda IQ



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### 1. Notification lights

The left LED is multicoloured and has a number of meanings: **solid green** when the battery is fully charged, **flashing green** when connected to the network, and **solid amber** when the battery is being charged or the phone is using ActiveSync to synchronise with a PC.

The right LED will flash **blue** when Bluetooth is on, **green** when Wireless LAN is on, and alternate **blue/green** if both are on.

### 2. Speakers

### 3. Display screen

#### 4. Home

Press to go to the home screen.

#### 5. Left soft key

Press to perform the command on the label above the button.

#### 6. Contact

Press to launch the Contact list to make phone calls.

#### 7. Call key

Press to accept a call or to go to the phone keypad. Press and hold this if you want to activate/de-activate the speakerphone during a call.

#### 8. \* Key

Press to switch to different input modes or press and hold to choose an input mode or symbols from the list when entering text.

#### 9. Back

Press to go to the previous screen or to backspace over characters.

#### 10. Right soft key

Press to perform the command on the label above the button.

#### 11. Messaging

Press to launch Messaging to send and receive messages.

#### 12. End call key

Press to end a call.

#### 13. Navigation control/enter

Use to scroll left, right, up, or down. Or press straight down to use as the Enter button.

#### 14. # Key

Press to add a space, or press and hold to display a list of symbols.

#### 15. Light sensor

This senses when it's dark and activates a backlight under the keyboard, so that it's easier to see the buttons.

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### 1. Camera button

Press for the camera. If it's already running, press this to capture an image or video clip.

### 2. Strap ring

Use to hold the phone with a strap.

**Smart IQ:** press and hold the End call key to lock your phone.

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### 3. Infrared port

Lets you exchange file(s) or data with other devices wirelessly, or connect to your PC (if it has an infrared port) to synchronise with Microsoft ActiveSync.

### 4. Speaker

Listen to audio media or a phone call.

### 5. Power button

Press to turn the phone on and off. Or press and quickly release to display the Quick list, which allows you to change profiles and switch to flight mode.

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#### 6. Sync connector

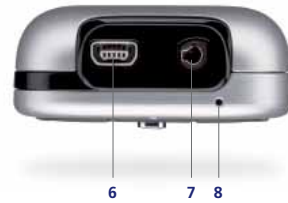
Use to synchronise data or recharge the battery.

#### 7. Earphone jack

Listen to audio media or use the phone's hands-free kit.

#### 8. Microphone

Speak into this when receiving a phone call or making one or a voice recording.

**Smart IQ:** press and hold the Earpiece volume down button to record a voice 'tag' for each of your contacts. You'll be able to then call them just by saying the name!

#### 9. Connection manager

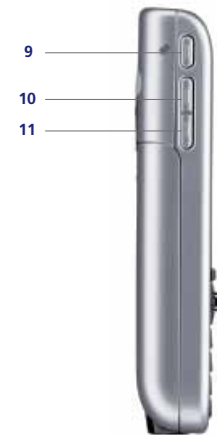
Press to activate the connection manager to turn on Bluetooth or Wireless LAN, or press and hold to record a note to yourself.

#### 10. Earpiece volume up

Press to increase the earpiece volume during a call.

#### 11. Earpiece volume down

Press to decrease the earpiece volume during a call.



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### 1. Camera lens

Please keep this clean from fingerprint marks so that you can take the best quality pictures.

### 2. Car antenna connector

Lets you attach your phone to the car antenna for a better network signal reception. Simply peel off the rubber cap and connect the antenna jack. Replace the rubber cap if unused.

### 3. Self-portrait mirror

Position the phone until the mirror reflects the image you want to capture.

### 4. Back cover

Remove to insert battery, SIM card, and Mini-SD card (not included).

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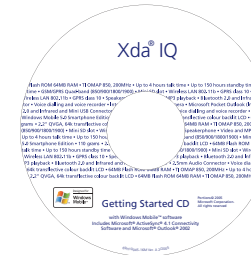

## General questions

### Can I use software designed for the Xda sp with my Xda IQ?

Xda IQ uses Microsoft Windows Mobile 5.0 as the core system. Applications written for the Xda sp may not work correctly.

You should contact the software vendor to check if the application will work correctly with Windows Mobile 5.0.

### Can I receive phone calls or text messages while using the Internet or synchronising email on my Xda IQ?

You can make and receive phone calls when using Wireless LAN. If you're actively using your connection in GPRS mode, your phone calls will be forwarded based on your settings – the default is to divert to voicemail (if it's set up) or another number. However, you can make and receive calls if your GPRS is idle.

### What are the maximum speeds of GPRS?

In GPRS mode, Xda IQ supports a maximum download speed of about 53kbps and an upload speed of 26kbps.

### How do I turn the phone off and go into PDA mode?

Press the power button at the top left edge of the phone, and select **flight** mode.

### When I'm overseas, why do I see a white triangle at the top of the screen?

The triangle means you're roaming on a foreign network and roaming charges apply.

### Can I close applications using one of the buttons?

Press the **End call** key.
